ON IT'S 45th ANNIVERSARY - THE YENKO NAME IS ALIVE AND WELL

Avid Car Collector and Yenko Enthusiast Recaptures Yenko Magic with PossibleNew Yenko Models, Fresh Product Lines Westminster, Calif. - (October 14, 2009) As the 45th Anniversary of the Yenko legacy draws near, General Marketing Capital Incorporated (GMCI) announced today its ownership of the classic trademark and its plans to revitalize the brand. To jump start this effort, Yenko owner, enthusiast and GMCI CEO Jeff Leonard, is consulting with several notable limited production vehicle companies in the automotive industry on possible new Yenko project cars as well as upcoming Yenko product lines. "The muscle car era has made a huge comeback this year and we expect this trend to grow," said Leonard. "The Yenko name is very much a part of that magnificent history and we plan to resurge its magic and its historical significance. Through GMCI's efforts, Don Yenko's name will be kept alive with the highest degree of integrity and respect." Growing up in Detroit in the shadow of the famous Woodward Avenue during the muscle era heyday, Leonard always had a keen interest in Detroit muscle culture. As a muscle car enthusiast and owner of an original 1968 Yenko Camaro, Leonard shares the enthusiasm and excitement of many towards owning a unique piece of Yenko history. Originally, the 60s era Yenko car was a special order vehicle, available only through Don Yenko Chevrolet in Canonsburg, PA. Don Yenko used the Central Office Production Order (COPO) program, a program GM used for fleet vehicles like police cars, taxi cabs, etc. to special order the most powerful vehicles available. Yenko modified his first vehicle, the Chevrolet Corvair, in 1965 for the Sports Car Club of America racing team. Yenko later went on to build the Yenko Super Camaro, Yenko Deuce, Yenko Chevelle, Yenko Super Nova, Yenko Vega Stinger and the Yenko Camaro Turbo Z among the fastest SCCA racing cars ever produced.

A brief meeting was held to review the activities agenda for the new year. Dave Ellis reported on the March 20 display engine assembly session to be held at Chuck Facklam's in East Aurora. Dave sent a separate e-mail recently reminding the ACORNers to contact him if they want to ride with him or follow him to Chuck's. This will be a turbo engine to be displayed with the other four engines [cut-away, '60, Canadair, and prototype] on display at the Buffalo Transportation/Pierce Arrow Museum. The museum specializes in all things automotive that were made in the Buffalo area. The Corvair Preservation Foundation provided these engines for display except for the Canadair engine which was donated by the Niagara Frontier Corvair Club. The turbo engine will be assembled to look "pretty" for display and not for operation, so the assembly procedure should go fairly quickly. It is to be completed during a second session on April 17.

I learned of several things during the meeting [see what happens when we have just one month off?]:

- The Fling's car is back among the living. For a while, reports indicated that it's engine had one foot in the grave. Jerry reported that it was running well at the end of the last year [but it still hasn't quit smoking]. The big test will be how it does the first time he turns the key in 2010.
- The LoCurto convertible project has taken another turn [How's that for writing? "convertible...taken another turn" Oh, never mind.] After tallying up the cost for metal work, it was noted that the lines on the cost graph for "restoration" vs "buying a turnkey car" crossed. Joe has the car for sale and is looking at the '63 convertible Tom Nasman has. Stay tuned for further developments.
- Dave Ellis is working on bringing back the 700 sedan he got from Joe. There aren't
 many 700 models around. They fit between the starkly functional 500s and the upscale
 Monzas and were dropped after 1964. They had different interior and exterior trim and
 were part of Chevy's marketing strategy of finding every price gap in a product line and
 providing a model to fill it.

Unfortunately, President Paul Masters and First Lady Pat were unable to attend. Pat had low back surgery several weeks ago while Paul had heart plumbing surgery just the week before the dinner. We hope you both are improving daily.
