# **Restoration Business Closes**


Harwood Automotive, the restoration shop in Victor our I club visited two years ago has closed. It appears that all I the equipment will be auctioned off soon. *editor*

#### REPAIRING THAT RUSTED OUT NUT UNDER THE BACK SEAT (Accelerator bracket)



Here's the nut, and the bolt that screws into it. The weld on the nut is still intact. It had rusted around the outside of the weld. This nut is in a recess on the floor board; a natural place for water to collect. (Think convertible)

As you can see in the photo above, the bolt is 'special'. It has a 7/16" shank and a 5/16x 18 threads. It is 1 7/16" long.

My replacement is a grade 5, 7/16" bolt that is 2" long. I filed around the shank, just below the head so a washer would fit snug against the head of the bolt. The shank on the  $7/16 \times 2$  bolt is the same length as the shank on the original bolt. This gives the linkage the same amount of space to ride on when installed.



Underside of Floor board




I used a 'threaded' washer to lock the linkage in place on the shank of the bolt. Use a washer a size smaller than the bolt, file it out a little so it will just start on the threads, then screw it down on the bolt to thread it. A half thickness nut would probably work better, and I'll do that to mine next time I'm under the car. (I didn't have another nut in my nuts and bolts can!)

The other washers are for spacers, and the large washer against the floor board is to give support around the rusted area.


The bolt was a little long, and I'll cut it off after I get the washer and bottom nut welded to the floor. I might leave the double nut on, just for that warm fuzzy feeling.

All the stuff can be purchased at any hardware store, so if you are stranded on the road by this, if you can get under the car, you can fix it and get on your way with only a couple of wrenches and a couple of bucks.
