Jim Bartasevich's "The Sixty-Niner" **Newsletter Article**



The 500s are the orphans of the Corvair line. Everyone wants a Monza or Corsa; but they still have their charms. This photo was taken at the '69 Reunion in Richmond, VA, in 1999. The guy giving it the "lean test" is your editor. Here's a little information about me: Actually, I am a safety consultant for business and industry. I'm in my early 60s, and I'm married with two adult daughters. [We'll be adding a chocolate Lab this spring.] My "winter" car is a 2006 VW GTI, Mk V. History, antique farm equipment and RMS Titanic are a few of my other hobbies. [Do you see a trend here with "old" things?] I'm a CSP, a Certified Safety Professional. Huh? A safety guy who owns a Corvair? [Four, actually.] I have a Lakewood [140/4 speed], a '64 Spyder convertible, a '65 Corsa coupe [140/4 speed], and the 500 [110/PG] you see above. I got the Corvair bug when I learned to drive on my parents' '65 500 coupe, 110/4speed. That's all it took. I "converted" it to a Corsa with some exterior trim and paint, a dual exhaust [glass packs, of course] and IECO 2bbl ram induction. While in college, my father had an accident with it in 1971. Fortunately, the only injury he had was a minor cut on his lip. Unfortunately, the 500's "injuries" were fatal. I was busy in college in my junior year at that time and was without a car anyway, so I wasn't desperate. [I had joined CORSA as a charter member, so I was still "attached" to the Corvair.] When my senior year arrived, I was going to need a car for job hunting, and there was no question about what kind of car it would be. Wanting to move up to a luxurious Monza or Corsa, I began my search in the spring of 1972 in Eastern Ohio where I lived. There were slim pickings in the small towns in the area, so I went to Pittsburgh for a look. Surprisingly, there weren't many to be found, most apparently having become victims of the salty winters. Back home, my father told me that he heard about a Corvair for sale, right in our home town. Off I went and found, somewhat disappointedly, a 500 coupe with a PG. Great; another basic car, and it has a PG. Lots of class and sport with this one. However, it didn't take me too long to get over my lack of enthusiasm, so I decided to buy it. 4575 was used as a second car, a "work" car, and sat outside. It had its share of nicks, dings minor surface rust spots, and a few small creases from several "misjudgments" by the owner. However, it had only 28,000 miles on it, it was all original, and it had been rustproofed by Ziebart. This was the clincher. I found a job that summer and had it repainted in it's original Garnet red the following year. I drove it to the first two Lime Rock Corvair events and the 1974 Chicago CORSA convention. [I found the Spyder the same year, so the "stigma" of a PG in a base car disappeared.] It now has about 48,000 miles on it. In 1977 I took it to the Minneapolis CORSA convention. I've grown to appreciate the 500s. The lack of adornment e m p h a s i z e s h o w stunning [Yes, I said stunning.] the design of the late models are. There are very few cars that have looked good through all the eras of automotive design in which they've existed. You can see the other members of my Corvair family on my Facebook page.

ETHANOL AND YOUR OLD CAR

A great deal of information is floating around classic car enthusiast about ethanol, and for good reason. The general consensus appears to be that even 10% is not good over the long haul for our classic Corvair's. (I won't even go to the use of our direct and indirect food source for fuel discussion). It is a fact that ethanol is highly corrosive and does a job on seals and gaskets of older cars. It also has a much higher evaporation rate than straight gasoline. Corvair owners have reported a 10%-15% drop in fuel mileage and a noticeable decline in power. Corvair forums have identified rough idle and contaminated carburetors using E10 (10% Ethanol). Now just may be the time to begin adding one of the special ethanol protection stabilizers/treatments to your gas tank. editor

Effects

Low concentrations of ethanol (around 5 to 10 percent) may weaken and eventually destroy rubber parts such as gaskets and seals. As concentrations get higher, ethanol removes buildup in the gas tank that could then get caught in other parts.

Potential

Ethanol tends to retain water. This water retention could rust gas tanks and cause water damage to other components.

Considerations

The exact effects of gasohol on older cars will depend on the particular year and model of the car, as well as the percent of ethanol in the gasohol compound.

Prevention/Solution

Car owners should clean out their car's fuel tank and seal it with an ethanol-proof material if they are worried about potential complications from ethanol. People not planning to use an old car for a while should add a fuel stabilizer.

In Memoriam...


It is with a sad heart I note the recent passing of Thelma Durbin.
