- 2. **Chicken Françoise**-Boneless breast of chicken dipped in a light egg batter with a lemon-butter sauce combining garlic and sweet vermouth.
- 3. Pecan Salmon-Pecan crusted Atlantic salmon sautéed and finished with a maple butter sauce
- **4. Rosemary Rubbed Sliced Sirloin**-Served with garlic mashed potatoes, fresh seasonal vegetables and bordelaise sauce
 - 5. **Chicken Marsala with Wild Mushrooms**-Boneless breast of chicken sautéed with herbs and served with a Marsala mushroom sauce
- 6. **Penne Pasta with Chicken and Sausage**-Grilled chicken and Andouille sausage tossed with penne pasta in a lightly spiced tomato cream sauce
