The meeting was opened with an announcement by Dave Shoemaker that Jeff Clark has agreed to assume the duties of Membership Chair. In return, Dave offered to assume the position of Vice-President. A motion was made and the vote was unanimous, with the stipulation that the club's by-laws need to be reviewed, as no one could recall a vote for office other than the one held during the annual meeting in November.

A motion was made that annual dues be increased to \$20.00 per year, a vote was held and the motion passed. Bad Connections






Many times at car shows or just poking around looking at other people's cars I am often amazed at how people wire things up and make electrical connections. While I am not an electrical engineer, I am able to read a wiring diagram, while working

neatly and safely, this is very important when working with any electrical system.

The Corvair, unlike modern cars is very simple to work



on and this tends to be the case with the wiring on the car as well. The simple glass fuses and open access to the wiring makes things easy to service and troubleshoot. Take the coil connections for example, easy to see connect and disconnect makes servicing very easy. It also makes for a connection that is often broken and replaced poorly as many Corvairs I see have open colored crimped terminals replacing the factory ends. While these terminal lugs are fine, if

they are to be used on an environment such as an engine compartment they should not be used alone as they are prone to corrosion if the connections are made properly. Simply by using heat shrink tubing after replacing the terminals not only makes the finished repair look nice, it keeps the exposed end of the connection scaled from the element of the connection of the co



connection sealed from the elements.

Another nice product is to use black zip ties to keep wiring neat and together. Make sure you line up the ends and have them all facing in the same position, as this small detail will make your finished repair look professional. Almost any auto parts supply store will also house the black plastic wire shield, this is a great product to run wires through and neaten areas up. Many of the Corvair vendors sell replacement connectors or you can also use many late model GM connectors which are far superior to the original GM styles, providing a great weather proof seal. Most any junkyard will let these factory harnesses go for next to nothing and they can be a great source of connectors and extra high quality wiring that can be reused for many projects.

Most automotive wiring repairs can be done with a few simple tools and I suggest that all connections be soldered if possible, this is easy to do and with a little practice can even be fun. Another great tool is a professional wire stripper that holds the wire as you use it, this is far superior than the typical set with wire crimpers built in. Remember to play it safe and always disconnect that battery as well before performing any electrical service. See, working on that old wiring system is easy and cheap, plus if you work neatly, can make a big difference in your engine appearance.
