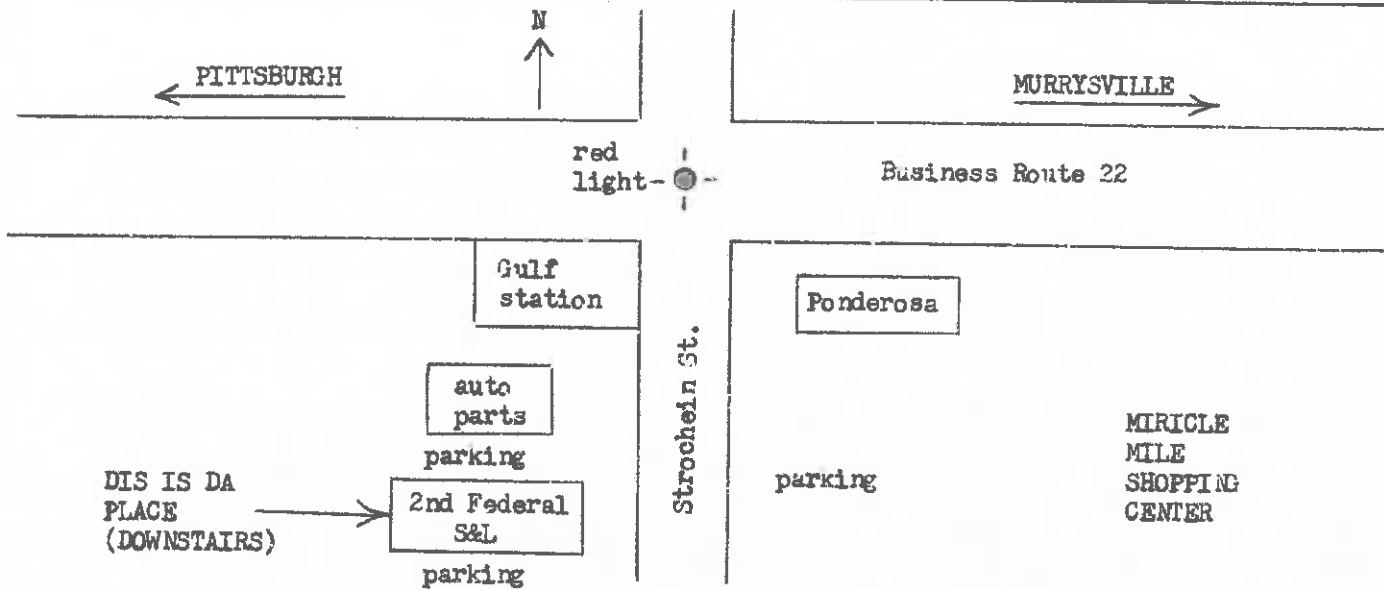

HERE ARE THE CORVAIR CONVOY PLANS - TUESDAY JULY 29 DEPARTURE <sup>^</sup>PROMPTLY AT 6A.M. TRAVELING PARKWAY EAST & WEST TO I 79, THEN SOUTH ON I 79 TO 84 LUMBER AT THE RT. 50 & I 79 EXIT. DEPARTING 84 LUMBER'S LOT PROMPTLY AT 6:30 A.M. THE 6 A.M. DEPARTURE FROM MONROEVILLE IS CRITICAL IN ORDER TO BEAT THE MORNING RUSH HOUR.
