



Luxury Sports Car of Tomorrow Is Unveiled Here

The car of tomorrow arrived in New York yesterday. It was an elegant blue creation placed on display on the main floor of Abercrombie and Fitch's sporting goods store at Madison Avenue and 45th Street. It will remain there until August 20.

This luxury sports car, called Phoenix, is the brainchild of John C. Fitch, international race driver, engineer and creator of many new and exciting machines in the automotive field over the last 20 years.

Fitch's newest car, designed in collaboration with noted industrial illustrator, Coby Whitmore, is based on the rear-mounted Chevrolet Corvair, six-cylinder, 170-horsepower air-cooled engine.

That means four speed synchromesh transmission, either manual or automatic, with enough horsepower to cruise comfortably at 100 miles per hour (in areas where such speeds are permitted).

The car has Koni adjustable shock absorbers, Weber carburetors, Girling disk

brakes and is equipped all around with the new Goodyear radial tires, themselves a creation for the future, and an electrically operated window in the rear of the Landaustyle top. The Steel body is made in Turin, Italy, by a special group of old world handcraftsmen.

The body lines of the Phoenix are different from any seen on the road today. The slight swelling on each side of the hood are tire wells, one carrying a rear spare and the other a spare for a front wheel. The rear wheels have seven-inch rims and the front wheels six-inch rims, so two sizes of tires are used.

Fitch is planning to produce about 500 units of the Phoenix in the first year. He is quoting a price of \$8,700 for the "rally" or competition version, while the normal road Phoenix will sell for \$8,300.

He has sold his first car to John Timken, a well-known auto racing and yachting man.

Fitch, who was born in Indianapolis in 1917, became a race driver soon after the

end of the second World War. He drove an MG. He has since driven at Le Mans, France, for Briggs Cunningham and has been a winner in most of the leading races in this country and many abroad.

As a car builder he has been successful with various combination of Fiats and Fords particularly of the 1934 V-8 version, and with Jaguar conversions as well.

His kit for the Corvair sprint car, a refinement that he brought out several years ago, is said to reached more than 100,000 in sales.

But Fitch's new two-seater Phoenix, weighing only 1,950 pounds, is a car of rare beauty and high performance, and is undoubtedly his masterpiece.

Headquarters of the Fitch Phoenix Company are in Falls Village, Conn., a small community only a few miles from Fitch's home at Lime Rock. That is also the site of Lime Rock Park, a 1.5-mile sports racing course that Fitch designed and ran for several years.
