TRUNK AJAR

Editor's note: "TRUNK AJAR" is a warning signal you would never expect to see in a Corvair, mainly because no one thought about such things in the 1960s, at least not for Corvairs.

Last year I made a trip for a week-long icon painting retreat to Dalton, PA (near Scranton) in Sarah's 2007 Pontiac G5. I think I was half way across the state when I noticed that the TRUNK AJAR light was on. Apparently I put my luggage in the trunk but didn't slam the trunk lid hard enough to lock it shut. No big deal, the trunk is in the back of the car and I took care of it on my stop for lunch.

As she has done in the past, Suzanne Heatherington wrote about an experience that she and her husband Jim lived through on there return trip home from Sylvania, Ohio. TRUNK AJAR.

n May 18 Jim and I packed the Corvair to leave the 2012 Happy Days Chevy Tour in Sylvania, Ohio. We had spent five wonderful days touring, with other 1955-1985 Chevies, around Toledo and southern Michigan, but we were eager to get home. I loaded the trunk and the lid closed on the first try—a first itself—and I considered it a good omen. We set off.

As we got onto the limited-access Route 23-South, heading towards the I-475 bypass around Toledo, we revved up to about 50 mph. **KABAM!** We could not see anything out of the windshield. The

trunk lid had flown open, blown up against the roof, and splatted there, a door instead of a window. Jim hit the brakes and eased to the right. I used the passenger window to guide him onto the berm. Traffic was light, fortunately, and we safely got onto the shoulder.

I jumped out and grabbed the trunk lid to pull it back down, to no avail. The lid itself was sprung and bent; the hinge on the passenger side was broken completely and the one on the driver's side was twisted. What to do?

A service-type van pulled in behind us. It was a state-certified vehicle carrying Steve Wallace, auto mechanic extraordinaire. Mr. Wallace is a member of the Ohio Statewide Freeway Service Patrol, a service of the Ohio Department of Transportation, which patrols state highways to help motorists in need. Steve was impressed with our 1968 Corvair, but not so impressed that he lost track of the main job, which was to get this particular car off the berm and safely on its way. He maneuvered the unbroken hinge and got the trunk lid closed. He even engaged the safety latch and secured the trunk lid so we could get back home. Reluctant now to drive at turnpike speeds, we drove

on secondary roads. They were beautiful, but we couldn't really enjoy the scenery for worry about that damaged lid. A five hour drive became ten hours.

Jim called Don Cekus who agreed to see what could be done. We were grateful, partly because we wanted to get the car fixed and partly because all our clothes were still in that darned trunk! Saturday morning, Don showed up, yet even a crowbar couldn't open the trunk lid. Don is nothing if not clever, and he took out the driver's side headlight assembly, along with its connections and the bucket that holds it. reached into the trunk and released the trunk's safety latch. What a guy!

We got the lid off, got out our stuff, and we're already halfway to getting our Corvair back on the road. We feel fortunate that the accident had no serious consequences and that, with Don's help and expertise, we'll be touring again in no time.
