

### Johnny Appleseed Festival, Lisbon, Ohio

### **About the Festival**

Lisbon, Columbiana County, Ohio September 15 - 16, 2012

The Johnny Appleseed Festival is a two day event that begins with a parade in the historic downtown square on September 15th at 11:00am. The Festival is filled with local entertainment of dancing, music, and theatre. Many local organizations provide old fashioned apple butter, apple ice cream, apple fritters and apple dumplings. There is an apple pie baking contest along with 35 food concessions, arts and crafts including yarn spinning, goat milk soap, chain saw wood crafts, dunk tank, games and much more. There is also a car and motorcycle show. It is truly a time when everyone gets together for hard work and lots of fun.

HE TRIP BEGAN with everyone meeting at the Eat'nPark lot in Robinson Twp. off Rte. 60. There were five Corvairs, a 68 Cougar and one late model Dodge Ram. The Hiebers drove their '65 Monza 2 dr. The Cekus' had their red '65 Monza conv., the Duva's had their '69 2 dr., Les Walters and Don Baker came in Les's '66 500 2 dr., and Artzbergers came in their modified '66 2 dr. Steve Puskas brought his '68 Cougar, as his Corvairs were under repair. Jim Steigerwaldt drove his Dodge pick up, maybe a future classic.


