Reprinted from Where?

The following items were found in the August 1960 issue of MOTOR:

From the article "Factory Service Slants":

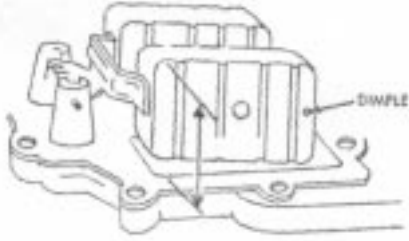
Corvair carburetors must be identified by the marks on the float and by the needle valve to assure correct float setting. Floats with and without a dimple mark have been used, as well as both solid and spring-loaded needle valves.

On carburetors with a solid needle valve, and which do not have a dimple identification mark the float setting is $1 \frac{13}{64}$ in. Make the measurement vertically from the top of the gasket surface to the top center of the float.

On carburetors which have both a dimpled float and a spring-loaded needle valve, the float setting is $\frac{7}{16}$ in., measured vertically from the top of the gasket surface to the dimple.

The float setting on carburetors with a dimpled float and a solid needle valve should be $1 \frac{13}{64}$ in., measured from the top of the gasket surface to the top of the float at the pivot end.

The solid needle valve should be used as a service replacement for the spring-loaded type, and the float without the dimple should be used when a replacement is made.



Carburetor with dimpled float and solid needle valve requires 1 13/64 in. float setting at location indicated by arrows.
